The World Archery Field Championships and the World Archery 3D Championships will be held consecutively in Yankton, South Dakota, United States of America, from 22 September to 3 October 2026. This championship series will begin at the scenic Lewis & Clark Lake Archery Field Ranges and conclude with the elimination and finals at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center (NEYAC) Ranges.

For the first time, the World Archery Field Championships and the World Archery 3D Championships will be staged together in the same location as part of a single championship series. 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# PRELIMINARY & FINAL REGISTRATION

## General considerations

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All entries, accommodation reservations, transport needs, flight arrival/departure information and visa invitation letter requests are to be completed using the World Archery Registration Online System (WAREOS).

This system handles the entire registration process for this event. No information related to entry forms, hotel reservations or transportation forms received outside the official registration website (WAREOS) will be accepted.

Member associations can log in to WAREOS at <https://extranet.worldarchery.sport> with the username and password assigned by World Archery. After entering WAREOS:

- Selecting the event from the list will allow a member association to register their athletes.
- Select/press the “Entries” button to see the list of categories in the event.
- Select/press the “category” to enter the athlete and official numbers/details of those participating in that event.

A WAREOS User Manual can be downloaded in PDF format (English) upon login. For any technical problems regarding WAREOS contact [wareos@archery.sport](mailto:wareos@archery.sport).

For any questions regarding the organization of the event (transport, accommodation, meals, etc.) please contact **directly the LOC** at [yankton2026@nfaa.usa.com](mailto:yankton2026@nfaa.usa.com).

A maximum number of **three (3) athletes per country** (host country included) per championship is allowed to be registered into each category of the event. Preliminary entries have to be completed using WAREOS.

Member Associations can only use WAREOS to make any changes, amendments or cancellations to entries and will be able to do so at any time.

**IMPORTANT!**

If you encounter any difficulties in meeting the registration requirements by the stated deadlines, please contact both World Archery at [events@archery.sport](mailto:events@archery.sport) and the LOC at [yankton2026@nfausa.com](mailto:yankton2026@nfausa.com). Each situation will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis, and exceptions or waivers of penalties may be considered where duly justified.

**Registration considerations for participants attending both championships**

Individuals taking part in both championships must register for each event separately in WAREOS. To help the Organising Committee track participation across both championships, they should proceed as follows:

- Register for the World Archery Field Championships, indicating their actual arrival date and setting 27 September as their departure date.
- In the accommodation text field, indicate: “Will stay for both Championships”.
- Register separately for the World Archery 3D Championships, indicating 27 September as their arrival date and their actual departure date.
- Also in this registration, indicate: “Will stay for both Championships” in the accommodation text field.

If a participant will stay in a double room and share with different persons during each championship, this must be specified separately in the corresponding rooming list for each event during the registration process.





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# ACCOMMODATION

## General information

### **IMPORTANT!**

- Please note that there will be a limited number of rooms at each hotel. To ensure that you stay at your preferred hotel, please book your hotel as soon as possible.
- Reservations are only final after the LOC has received the deposit of 50%.
- Due to limited capacity a 'First Come, First Serve' policy will be followed.
- Regarding the availability of the rooms, the LOC reserves the right to direct the teams to the hotels of the same level.
- Most hotels do not have a restaurant, but dinner is available each evening at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center.
- The hotel room rates are per room per night, including Wi-Fi, breakfast at the hotels, meals at the venues and local transportation.



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### Deadlines

- Reservations should be made on or before **3 August 2026**

To confirm the reservation, a 50% deposit of the total amount is required to be bank transferred to the LOC on or before **3 August 2026**. Reservations after this date will be considered only according to availability.

- Final Hotel Reservation & Transportation on or before **23 August 2026**

### Staying in non-official hotels

Teams who do not reserve their accommodation through the organizing committee will be charged a fee of \$250 per person, per Championship.

Teams staying in non-official accommodation must complete accreditation procedures no later than the day before official practice. Failure to do so may result in delays in accreditation processing and may affect participation eligibility.

In addition, the LOC will not be responsible for providing event information or transport to any hotel not on the official accommodation list.

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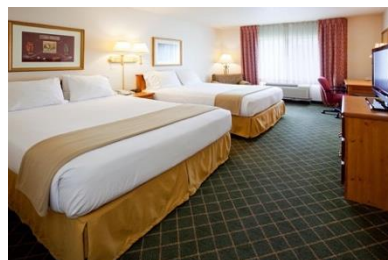

Delegations choosing non-official accommodation will be charged an additional organizational fee of USD 250 per person, per championship. This fee applies to all registered athletes and team officials not booked through the official accommodation system and does not include local transport or meals unless specifically stated by the LOC.

There is no entry fee for teams.

### IMPORTANT!

Individuals taking part in both championships must register for each event separately in WAREOS, as indicated in the section “Registration considerations for participants attending both championships”.

The entry fee includes accreditation, competition participation, official practice access and local transport between official hotels and official venues during the qualification, elimination and finals (timetable to be confirmed on site) during each championship period. Accommodation and airport transfers are not included in the entry fee.

\*VIP ACCESS – Must be approved by LOC before credentials are issued. Examples of VIP’s include Presidents of Federations, Secretary General, World Archery Officers, etc.

VIP credentials provide access to VIP area at finals venue and specialized transportation. Please note - transportation is not available from non-official hotels.





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VIP and Guest entry fees do not include Field of Play access for qualification or elimination rounds.

### Payment conditions

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The entry fees should be paid in full before arrival.

To confirm hotel reservations, a minimum 50% deposit of the total amount is required to be bank transferred to the LOC on or before **3 August 2026**. Reservations after this date will be considered only according to availability.

The final outstanding balance shall be made via bank transfer before arrival. Accommodation cannot be guaranteed after this deadline. A balanced invoice will be provided via WAREOS.

### Cancellations & Changes

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All cancellations and changes must be made through WAREOS:

- Cancellations received before 23 August 2026 will receive a full refund of the deposit.





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- Cancellations received on or after 24 August 2026; no refund will be given.
- Refunds will be processed after the event.
- Name changes to team officials or athletes (same category and division) will be accepted up to two (2) days before official practice without any additional charge or penalty fees.
- Should flight arrival details change last minute, please contact the Organizing Committee using the details indicated in the team managers' booklet.
- If a participant's arrival is later than the original scheduled arrival date, the room will be charged from the date of the original booking in WAREOS.
- An email will automatically notify the Organizing Committee and Member Association of any changes made in WAREOS.



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## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

### Transportation

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Transportation will be provided from the two official airports:

- Joe Foss Regional Airport in Sioux Falls, SD (FSD)
  - 80 mi / 130 km from the venue to the official hotels
  - Two days before the official practice day and one day after the closing day.
- Eppley Airfield in Omaha, NE (OMA)
  - 156 mi / 251 km from the venue to the official hotels
  - Two days before the official practice day and one day after the closing day

The cost of this service is \$20 USD per person one way to/from Sioux Falls Airport and \$30 USD per person one way to/from Omaha Airport.

Local transport will be available between official hotels and archery venues. Transport timetables will be confirmed. Buses and/or vans will be provided.

### Lunch at the venues

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Meal services apply according to each delegation's confirmed arrival/departure dates and championship participation, as registered in WAREOS.

Lunch is included in hotel charge. Those signed up through official hotel bookings will be provided:

- a box lunch – on practice and qualification days at the field
- a warm lunch – on elimination and finals days, at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center.

### Dinner

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Full board accommodation includes dinner service each evening at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center. Half board includes breakfast and lunch, with the option of adding dinner at \$20.00 per person, per night. To add dinner service, teams should sign up in advance on



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WAREOS. Teams that do not select dinner service at the complex will be responsible for their own evening meals and transportation to and from dining locations.

### Water on the Venue

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Bottled water will be available on the field free of charge.

### Banquet

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The LOC will host a Gala Dinner on Sunday, September 27, following the conclusion of the World Archery Field Championships.

Participation is open to Field participants, 3D participants arriving on 27 September, and accompanying officials/guests, subject to prior registration in WAREOS

The cost is \$20 USD per person for those on full board accommodations, or \$40 USD per person for all others.

The final schedule, venue and transport arrangements for the Gala Dinner will be communicated in the Team Managers' Booklet.

### Training

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A training field will be available starting 20 September 2026. The training facility is at the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center.

Teams who wish to arrive and practice earlier than this date, please contact the LOC directly to make arrangements. A fee of \$10.00 per day/per person will be charged and individuals will have access to both the indoor and outdoor facilities.

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Late September and early October in Yankton are expected to bring variable temperatures, generally ranging from 7°C to 21°C (45°F to 70°F). Teams are advised to prepare for cool mornings, warmer afternoons and changing weather conditions.

Qualification ranges may include areas of rough terrain, please bring appropriate footwear.

Average sunrise is 7:30AM and average sunset is 7:00PM.

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# IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING VISAS

A visa will be required of all visitors to enter the United States except for Canada and the 38 nations that are part of the “Visa Waiver Program.”

Application for and obtaining travel visas to the United States are completely and solely the responsibility of the participating teams.

The process for obtaining a visa requires each individual to submit an application through a U.S. Embassy or U.S. Consulate. This is a process that **MUST** be done by the applicant – the organizing committee cannot do it for you!

Participants eligible under the U.S. Visa Waiver Program must still ensure they meet all ESTA and entry requirements.

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## ARCHERY VENUES

### NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center

800 Archery Lane, Yankton, SD, 57078



Yankton, South Dakota is the home of National Field Archery Association Foundation, and the first of the Easton Foundations Archery Centers. Situated on over 130 acres; the NFAA Easton Yankton Archery Center includes three outdoor field ranges, a 3D range, two FITA ranges, two 90m indoor ranges, two classrooms, a fitness studio, an art studio and the NFAA Foundation Archery Museum.

In 2007, Yankton beat out several Midwest cities to become the new headquarters' of the National Field Archery Association (NFAA). The original plan called for a 4,000 square foot office building to house the NFAA staff. In partnership with the NFAA Foundation, the Easton Foundations saw the opportunity to add on to the NFAA Headquarters and create a multi-million-dollar, state-of-the-art archery training facility. With incentives from the City of Yankton, the county and the state of South Dakota; the low cost made it impossible for the Easton Foundation to refuse. With that, the project grew to over 20,000 square feet.

In 2011 and again in 2017, the NFAA Foundation broke ground again with two separate expansion that added a combined 50,000 square feet and extended the building to include the World's first indoor 90-meter range and an archery distribution warehouse. The ranges have a combined 38 targets with 76 full-length shooting lanes, in a climate-controlled environment for year-round shooting. With movable targets, the range can be set up for shooting at any distance and can accommodate as many as 80 targets for 18-meter (20 yard) tournaments.





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Easton Field and First Dakota Field are 90-meter grass fields with room for a combined 130 targets and 260 shooting lanes. Awnings cover the entire width of the ranges, providing shade for the archers between ends, and a lawn behind the shooting line allows for spectators.

### Lewis & Clark Archery Field Range

Archers may take advantage of a 28-target NFAA (National Field Archery Association) certified archery range, as well as a practice range. The archery range is set up into two, 14-target rounds and is laid out in a wooded section of the park, giving archers a natural setting to enjoy their sport with an elevated shooting platform with a 6' and 12' level for shooting at 3D targets.





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# THE CITY OF YANKTON

Yankton may be South Dakota's most historic town located on the northern bank of the Missouri River. Life in Yankton has always revolved around the Missouri River. Native Americans followed the river's flow to their destination's centuries ago. Citizens today use the river for various recreational activities that include: boating, fishing, kayaking and skiing.

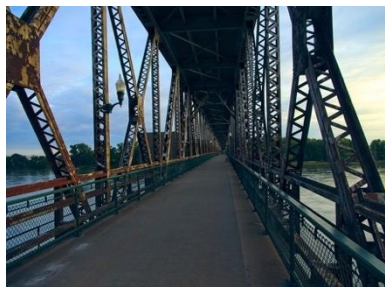




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## 2. Meridian Bridge and Meridian Plaza



The Meridian Bridge, a landmark in Yankton since 1924, is the result of hard work and determination of local citizens. The bridge closed to vehicle transportation in October 2008, but opened in November 2011 to foot traffic. The bridge welcomes both foot and bike traffic. Spanning over 3,209 feet, the Meridian Bridge is the longest pedestrian bridge connecting two states, Nebraska and South Dakota. It officially opened on October 11, 1924 and was the first permanent bridge crossing the Missouri River. This unique bridge is a “double-decker” with one lane positioned above another. It was constructed as a lift-span bridge to allow riverboat traffic to traverse the river. Up until 1953, it was operated as a toll bridge.

## 3. The Meridian District



Stroll through the downtown area and browse many individually owned and operated businesses and unique shops. You’ll discover specialty gift, clothing and antique shops, as well as art galleries, home furnishing, decorating and business services, food, drink and entertainment all to suit your needs. Historic downtown Yankton offers small town charm, unique architecture and area attractions and events all year round. Located along the Missouri River, just blocks away from historic neighborhoods, sites, museums and community parks.

## 4. Missouri National Recreational River





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Did you know Yankton has a National Park? That's right, the Missouri National Recreational River runs right along Yankton's historic waterfront. Come discover beautiful stretches of the Missouri River with plenty of outdoor activities, including miles of trails for hiking, biking, running and paddling. Start your visit at Riverside Park where there are exhibits detailing the history of the Lewis & Clark Expedition, the steamboat era and the Dakota Territorial Capital. The Meridian Bridge offers a wonderful vantage point to look up and down the Recreational River's Wild and Scenic waters.

Consequently, the Member Association who wishes to register to an event, and book some or all associated extras proposed by the local organizing committee acknowledges that they are fully aware present terms and conditions are accepted by entering information in WAREOS.

Any Member Association declares that it is entitled to enter a contractual relationship with the Local Organising Committee of the event, in accordance with these terms and conditions.

The Local Organising Committee commits itself to communicate, within reason, to its potential clients the greatest information available on the following topics:

- Description of the main characteristics of the proposed products and of their use.
- Pricing
- Information on the methods of payment and reimbursement conditions.

## Article 1: Entirety

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The platform <https://extranet.worldarchery.sport/wareos/> is the propriety of, has been designed and created and is managed by

World Archery Federation at Lausanne, Switzerland, and put at the disposal of the Local Organising Committee to facilitate registration to World Archery events.

The present terms and conditions include any and all rights and obligations of the parties. No single, specific, or general term or condition that may appear on documentation sent, given, or handed over to a Member Association will alter, replace, or complete parts of or the entirety of these terms and conditions

World Archery reserves the right to modify at any time and without any preliminary notification of any kind these terms and conditions.

## Article 2: Object

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The present terms and conditions define the rights and obligations of the parties in relation to the registration made through the platform <https://extranet.worldarchery.sport/wareos/> of services offered by the Local Organising Committee in the scope of the event it has been set for.





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### Article 3: Contractual documents

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The present terms and conditions and the registration process make up the contractual documents between the parties.

### Article 4: Electronic signature:

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The Member Association's entering registration information is the electronic signature which is binding between the parties in the same sense as a handwritten signature would be.

### Article 5: Registration

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Confirmation – Contract

The contract is validated as soon as the Member Association has entered its preliminary registration by entering information in WAREOS. A modification of the registration is possible until the deadline for registration set in the document. Modifications may be subject to penalty fees.

### Article 6: Prices

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The official prices are listed in the "Policies and Procedures Athletes, officials and team management", the invitation package prices will be based on the official price list, converted to the currency elected by the LOC for invoicing (CHF, EUR, or USD).

The official prices valid on the date that the registration confirmation is sent to the Member Association are binding between the parties.

### Article 7: Payment methods

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All payments shall be made by bank transfer to the organising committee respecting the stated deadlines, with all bank charges paid by the Member Association. For any open invoices that are not settled 21 days prior the beginning of the event, the Local Organising committee will be entitled to charge a 5% surcharge on all open amounts.

Any payments received cash by World Archery on behalf of the organising committee will incur a 10% additional service fee, to be paid to World Archery.



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### **Article 8: Payment deadlines and refunds**

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After the final deadlines of registration mentioned in this document, Member Association will not be entitled to any refund, and all remaining unpaid amounts shall be paid to the Local Organising Committee.

Failure to do so, will results in an immediate suspension of the Member Association, who will be set as not in good standing on the day of the official practice of the event, and so until the full amount is paid to the LOC.

### **Article 9: Availability of services**

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The availability of services is guaranteed on a first come, first serve basis, provided that the payment of such service has been paid to the local organising committee, partially or in full as mentioned in this document.

The local organising committee is not required to hold services for a Member Association that as not paid in full such service.

### **Article 10: Force-majeure**

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None of the two parties will have failed in their respective contractual obligations if their execution is delayed or prevented by a case of force-majeure. Cases considered to be a force majeure are extraordinary events or circumstances beyond the control of the parties, such as a war, strike, riot, crime, or an event described by the legal term "act of God" (e.g, flooding, earthquake, volcano eruption, etc). However, force majeure is not intended to excuse negligence or other malfeasance of a party, as where non-performance is caused by the usual and natural consequences of external forces, or where the intervening circumstances are specifically contemplated. The party experiencing a force majeure must notify in writing with 24 hours after becoming aware of the occurrence. The parties will then, within 7 business days examine, unless the force majeure prevents it, if and how the contractual obligations will be met.
